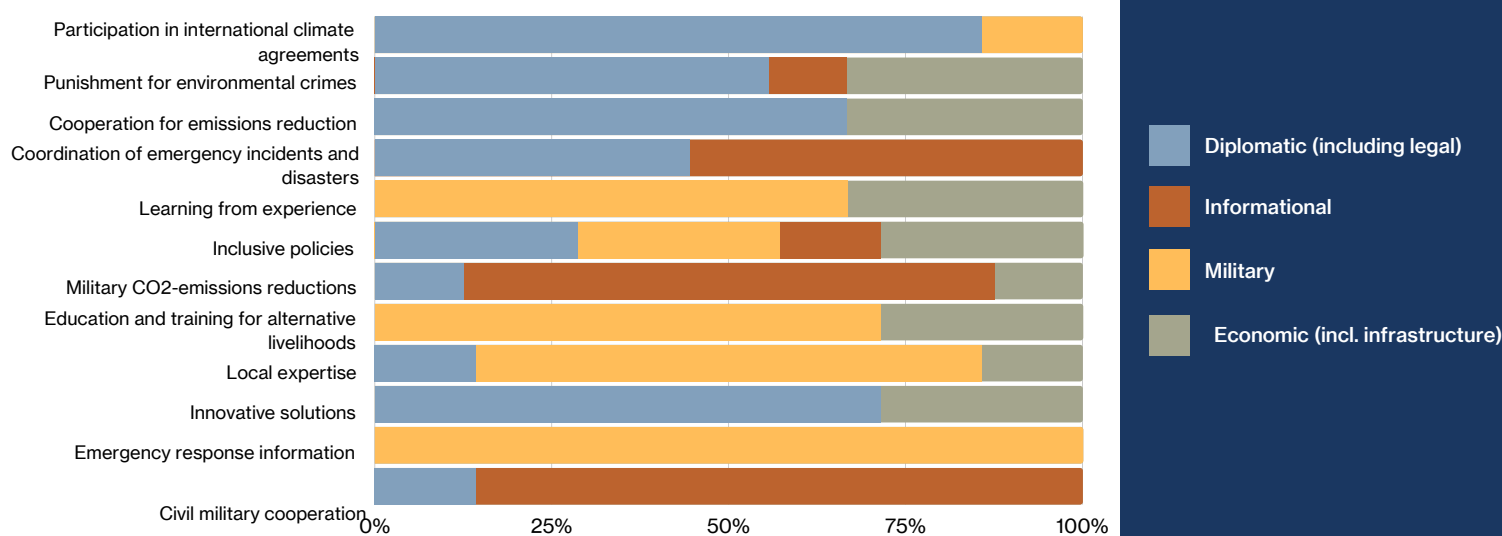

Climate security is about the relationship between national and human security and climate change. More specifically, it is about security threats to natural and human systems posed by climate change and its adverse impacts.

Climate Security is starting to get a global security priority. “ The punishment of environmental crimes, especially in the imposition of fines and sanctions, limits the effects of climate change by contributing to diminishing the frequency through which such crimes are carried out.

“ International climate agreements are the only conceivable pathway to preventing a climate crisis. Without it, governments will not find themselves forced to make the necessary painful decisions and the change in personal behavior will simply be too small to have an impact.

“ The military is often dependent on its communication and cooperation. It should work on strengthening its relationship with local partners as well as with companies within their own countries.
